The Upper Shore Regional Council (USRC), an economic development and planning organization for Queen Anne's, Kent and Cecil Counties, will be holding a full Council meeting on Thursday, December 13, 2012, at 1:30 p.m. at Schaeffer's Canal House in Chesapeake City. The USRC's Executive Board is comprised of County Commissioners from the three counties and the Council's Executive Director, Doris S. Mason. The Board Chair, William W.
