The Upper Shore Regional Council (USRC), an economic development and planning agency for Cecil, Kent, and Queen Anne's Counties, will be hosting an Executive Board meeting on Thursday, February 20, 2014, at 1:30 p.m. The Executive Board is comprised of County Commissioners from the three counties and the Council's Executive Director, Doris S. Mason. The Board includes, David Dunmyer, Chair, representing Queen Anne's County; Diana Broomell, 1st Vice Chair, Cecil County; Ronald Fithian 2nd Vice Chair, Kent County; James Moran, 3rd Vice Chair, Queen Anne's County, Dr. Alan J. McCarthy, Cecil County and William W. Pickrum, Treasurer of Kent County. Senator Stephen S. Hershey represents the Maryland General Assembly on the Board of Directors for the region. The Executive Board meetings, which are held twice per quarter, may be conducted in either of the three partner counties.

The full USRC Council, which meets quarterly, will meet again on March 20, 2014 in Cecil County (location TBD.) The Council consists of State Senators and Delegates representing the region, County Commissioners of the three Counties, Municipal Representatives of the individual towns, and the County Administrators.

Additionally, members from partner agencies across the region, including Economic Development and Tourism Directors, Chamber of Commerce Presidents, and others who participate on the Council's planning committees are invited to attend.

Partners and members from the various businesses and services delivery sectors from the region are often invited to the meetings. Either of the above groups may be represented on the agenda. Finally, the Council's Executive Director presents an update on the Council's current major projects.
